## DISCOVERING A CITY : NEW-YORK

### What you must see in New-York :

- The Empire State Building : it is 381 meters high and there are 102 floors . It was named " #1 attraction in the US" by the 2022 TripAdvisor Travelers' Choice Awards.



- American Museum of Natural History : there are 34 millions specimens . It opened in 1878.



- Times Square : is is sometimes referred as "the Crossroads of the world" or "the Centre of the Universe". It is one of the world's most visited tourist attractions.



- the Statue of Liberty : it was made in 1886 by Gustave Eiffel . It is situated on Liberty Island.



## TRADITIONAL BRITISH FOOD

1. **Jelly** : it is a dessert made with sweetened and flavoured processed collagen product.
2. **Haggis** : it is a savoury pudding containing sheep's pluck (heart, liver and lungs), minced with onions, oatmeal, suet, spices and salt, mixed with stock, and cooked encased in the sheep's stomach.
3. **Baked beans** : they are white beans stewed in sauce.
4. **Plum pudding** (or Christmas pudding) : it is a sweet dried-fruit pudding served for Christmas dinner.
5. **Marmite** : it is a British savoury food spread based on yeast extract.
6. **Jellied eels** : it is made of chopped eels boiled in a spiced stock. It is usually served cold.
7. **Toad in the hole** : it consists of sausages in Yorkshire pudding batter .
8. **Bubble and Squeak** : it is made of cooked potatoes and cabbage, mixed together and fried.
9. **Scotch eggs** : boiled eggs wrapped in a sausage meat, coated in breadcrumbs and baked.
10. **Welsh rarebit** : it is hot cheese-based sauce served on slices of toasted bread.



## DISCOVERING A SPORT : ICE-HOCKEY



### History:

**The first stick of ice hockey was made in the mid-1830s by William DILLY. The first indoor match was played on 3rd of March in 1875.**

### Rules:

**An ice-hockey team is composed of one goaltender and five players. The objective of the game is to score goals by shooting the puck into the opponent's goal net at the opposite end of the rink. The players use their sticks to pass or shoot the puck.**

## **A RECIPE : EASY CHRISTMAS PUDDING**

### **Ingredients :**

- 1 cup raisins**
- 1 cup sultanas**
- 1 cup (self-raising) flour**
- 1 cup finely grated butter (about 115g)**
- 1 cup fresh brown breadcrumbs**
- 1 cup light muscovado sugar**
- 1 cup mixed nuts, chopped (+ extra to decorate)**
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon**
- 1 tsp ground mixed spice**
- 1 cup milk**
- 1 large egg**
- butter, for greasing**

### **For the butterscotch sauce :**

- 85g butter**
- 100g light muscovado sugar**
- 200ml double cream**
- 1 tsp vanilla extract**



### Step 1

**For the pudding, empty the first six cups and the nuts into a mixing bowl with the spices then stir in the milk and egg. Once well mixed tip into a buttered 1,5 litre pudding bowl.**

### Step 2

**Cover with a double layer of buttered foil, making a pleat in the centre to allow the pudding to rise. Tie the foil securely with string, then place in a steamer or large pan containing enough gently simmering water to come halfway up the sides of the bowl a lid, for 2 ½ hours. Check the water level during cooking, topping up if necessary.**

### Step 3

**For the sauce, put everything in a pan and bring slowly to the boil, stirring. Allow to bubble away for 2-3 minutes, still stirring, until the sugar has dissolved and the sauce over the pudding and decorate with the whole mixed nuts.**

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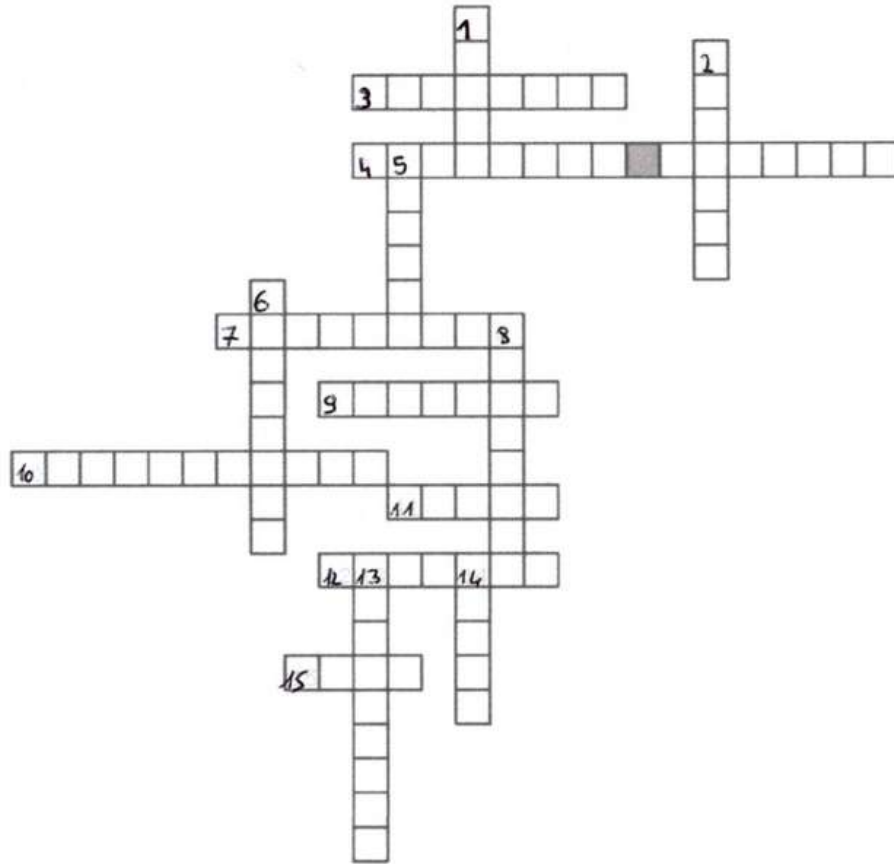
